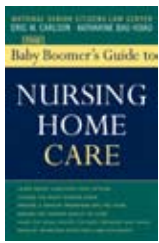
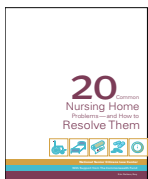


The Baby Boomer's Guide to Nursing Home Care
